- 5. Recipients are hereby notified that they are encouraged, to the greatest extent practicable, to purchase American-made equipment and products with funding provided under this program.
- 6. Subawards, transfers or contracting out of any work under the award require prior approval of the Grants Officer unless these items were approved in the basic award.
