## Part B: Narrative

Milestone Data Narrative: Please Describe in detail the types of milestone activities your SLIGP grant funded (Please reference each project type you engaged in. Example: Governance Meetings, Stakeholders Engaged)

During the Period of Performance (POP) 3,025 stakeholders were engaged to include New Jersey Office of Emergency Management (OEM) / State Police, county and local OEM coordinators, county and local first responder disciplines such as Police, Fire and EMS. Through the SLIGP grant, 43 people were able to attend broadband conferences and workshops in places to include Boston, Atlanta, Atlantic City, Las Vegas and Reston, Virginia. These conferences, to include the International Wireless Communications Expo, provided educational and informational awareness opportunities on public safety broadband technologies and allowed for New Jersey personnel to engage with other states and jurisdictions for rapid information sharing, collaboration, professional development and establishing partnerships. It also afforded the opportunity of NJOHSP participants to engage with wireless communications industry professionals to learn of top strategies and best practices to better the position of the Interoperable Communications Bureau and New Jersey moving forward during the transition between JerseyNet and FirstNet. The Governance Body consisted of 16 Members selected by the Director of the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness. The Membership included representation from both state and local agencies, diverse public safety disciplines, and urban and rural geographic areas throughout the State of New Jersey. Within the State of New Jersey is to the steering committee a Broadband Working Group was created that included subject matter experts from within the state. A program assessment was also completed by a subcontractor which provided detailed suggested improvements to the steering committee for outreach, governance and a frame work for the State Plan. There were 25 Governance Meetings convened over the POP.

The actual volume of Educational and Outreach Materials that were distributed was 111,639 articles, we used a multi-media approach which consisted of social media, printed materials, power points and webinars. This allowed NJOHSP to reach a larger audience.

Please describe in detail any SLIGP program priority areas (education and outreach, governance, etc.) that you plan to continue beyond the SLIGP period of performance.

The NJOHSP is planning to continue beyond SLIGP and into the SLIGP 2.0 with Educational and Outreach Materials to include social media, printed materials, power points and webinars. The SLIGP 2.0 will build on the foundation started in the first SLIGP grant. As a result of NJOHSP continued education and outreach on FirstNet to our public safety stakeholders as well as the success of the JerseyNet early builder program, two (2) JerseyNet jurisdictions have agreed to be early adopters of the NPSBN - the Atlantic City Police Department and Montclair State University Police Department.

Data collection narrative: Please describe in detail the status of your SLIGP funded data collection activities.

The collection of FirstNet data by survey was concluded in August 2016, a total of 634 surveys were returned. In September, the team normalized the data and entered it into the required templates. The data was submitted to FirstNet on September 29, 2016. Some of the data collection activities included meeting the needs of the state's public safety users including coverage, reliability, cost, and other requirements that will encourage network adoption, be sustainable, and enhance interoperability by providing a more reliable and robust network to carry state and local public safety entities. The data collection also outlined "User Requirements" for coverage, capacity required day-to-day and required during typical incident, hardening, types of devices and for their security. Public Safety Asset data was collected on the towers / structures, land, fiber and microwave, user and device populations on commercial networks for First Responders, Secondary Responders, Volunteers, Dual Network routers, Band Class 14 in-vehicle Modems/routers, Portables/smartphones and Tablets. Also user agencies and local jurisdictions requirements were reviewed for network architecture and access schemes, current and emerging broadband applications, critical infrastructure locations, interconnectivity requirements between these facilities and the level of local control desired by agencies and local jurisdictions.

Please describe in detail any data collection activities you plan to continue beyond the SLIGP period of performance.

The State of New Jersey intends to continue to collect the data listed by FirstNet in its February 2015 request. In carrying these activities, the project team will leverage lessons learned during the BTOP-financed JerseyNet project in the Route 21 Corridor, Atlantic City Region and in Camden County. The State intends to continue to collect data to include coverage objectives, in build-out phases, public safety entity information, including personnel counts, user maps based on jurisdiction, common response areas, application usage, current data usage, current mobile data providers, as well as current service plan types and costs and any current specialized services and public safety barriers to broadband adoption.

Lessons Learned: Please share any lessons learned or best practices that your organization implemented during your SLIGP project.

NIOHSP refined our outreach approach during the SLIGP period of performance during the engagement with New Jersey public safety stakeholders by producing educational materials and utilizing social media to promote awareness of FirstNet and through the distribution of one-page fliers and managing outreach attendance through SurveyMonkey to collect data from the public safety community on the what information they wanted to know about FirstNet and the Nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN).
