For stakeholder outreach, education, and engagement, we delivered consistent and inspiring messages through targeted use of web, face-to-face meetings and print newsletters. We developed three videos that educated stakeholders about FirstNet, LTE, and broadband, and a documentary about a pilot project that included dedicated band 14 cellular networks for real-world events and exercises at multiple OSU football games and a three-day exercise in Beavercreek Township. We also developed three situational awareness games for first responders that simulated the experience of the life-saving potential of an exclusive public safety broadband network provides when commercial networks fall. Face-to-face workshops and meetings were also held in conjunction with local first responders at various conferences and local events. Regularly scheduled governance meetings were held for SIEC, NPSBN sub-committees, and Region V Homeland Security.
