The SLIGP team had a booth and attended the Attorney General's Law Enforcement Conference in October. Becky Vanest and Kelly Castle attended the Ohio Digital Summit in October. Vanest and Castle also represented OhioFirst.Net at The Performance Institute FirstNet meeting in Washington DC on November 12.
