Describe your progress meeting each major activity/milestone approved in the Baseline Report for this project; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project milestones or information.

Milestones: While none of the meetings held during the quarter were considered to be stakeholder meetings or broadband conferences, information was shared regarding the National Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN).

No new staff was hired for the grant; however, the existing staff worked through the quarter developing a RFQ to hire a consultant(s). The RFQ will be issued in the first quarter of 2014 with selection and issuance of a purchase order(s) to follow likely in the second quarter of the year.

The Office of Emergency Communications (OEC) met with our staff as well as key stakeholders in December of 2013 for a Broadband Consultation Prep Workshop. This workshop was the only education and outreach activity to occur within the quarter; however, two workshops are planned for the first quarter of 2014. The first of the workshops, in January will be held by the MACINAC states to discuss the regional approach followed by an NTIA workshop in February.

Governance meetings for the existing land mobile radio system took place within the quarter with limited exposure to the NPSBN. Members of these committees have been provided regular updates on the NPSBN. Beginning with the next quarter, these meetings will transition into a format devoting equal time to the NPSBN.

Our SWIC attended the joint meeting of SAFECOM and the National Council of Statewide Interoperability Coordinators (NCSWIC) in December.

No subrecipient agreements are planned for the project.

Our pre-award expenditures as well as the expenditures for the personnel devoting time during the October-December time frame will be moved over to grant funding in early January and reflected on the next quarterly report. The time devoted to the State and Local Implementation Grant Program (SLIGP) this quarter included the planning of an RFQ to hire a consultant(s) to assist our team with County Infrastructure and Regional Task Force Meetings, re-writing of the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), requirements gathering services, creation of a marketing and outreach website, regional consultation and structural feasibility analysis. While the process of writing the RFQ and submitting it through the approval process has proven to take longer than expected, we anticipate hiring this consultant by early in the second quarter of 2014.

# 11d. Describe any success stories or best practices you have identified. Please be as specific as possible.

Pennsylvania participates in the Mid-Atlantic Consortium for Interoperable Nationwide Advanced Communications (MACINAC) Initiative. Members of the MACINAC consist of the six states within FEMA Region III. The Members of this Initiative are united to achieve their shared goal of maximizing efficiency and communications interoperability by creating a single regional public safety mobile broadband service and achieving the long-term widespread adoption and effective use of that service.
