In the fourth quarter, we wrapped up our presentation schedule to first responder agencies. We are now waiting for new developments from FirstNet that would warrant an updated presentation and contacts with Vermont first responders. Presentations were made to the Northfield Fire Department, Bristol Fire Department and Bellows Falls Fire Department. We also staffed an informational table at the Vermont HealthCare and EMS Preparedness Conference at Mt Snow. At the conference, we spoke directly to approximately two dozen first responders and secured emails to supply them with future updates on the project.

We conducted planning work for a statewide update meeting for first responders on the FirstNet project, along with a technology demonstration. That meeting had been planned for January 20, 2017. However, with the news that FirstNet would delay the announcement of the national partner due to litigation, we canceled that meeting and plan to reschedule it for later in 2017 as new information becomes available. It is a challenge to keep first responders interested in the project. We have already reached out numerous times to this population through in-person presentations, newsletters and electronic communications. We want to make sure that when we do call for a statewide meeting, first responders will have new information to consider.

The Public Safety Broadband Network Commission held one meeting during the quarter. That meeting was held on November 2. Our SPOC, Terry LaValley, attended the November 16 FirstNet meeting in Phoenix.

At each presentation, we give attendees a two-page handout on FirstNet. We also work to keep our web site up-to-date and post feature stories and other interesting items on the page to entice first responders to view the materials. For the fourth quarter, approximately 100 handouts were distributed in face-to-face meetings. The remaining materials were recorded via unique visitors to our web site. There were 452 unique visitors to the site and they viewed 5,273 pages.
