

SPECTRUM XXI

The SPECTRUM XXI (SXXI) class for **November 3 - 7, 2008** is open for registration. SXXI, for those of you that do not know, is a computer program that assists all government frequency managers at their own desktops. The program runs on most all Windows operating systems, and assists frequency assigners in finding, nominating, modifying or renewing frequency proposals or assignments. It includes the compliance checks that all proposals have to pass through at NTIA, so that your work can be checked and verified before you send it on. It has several engineering programs within it, such as point to point plots, coverage plots, including terrain features on those plots. SXXI also allows utilization of the NTIA SXXI Server for all unclassified work, if your agency has signed onto this server. That Server automatically tracks and reports to you on your work as it progresses through levels of approval up to the final FAS approval. But even without the Server, SXXI will save you hours of formatting and checking your work.

Class is for one week, is given in Bowie, MD, and is **FREE!**

It is open to all government frequency assigners, including any contractor support assigners your agency may have. You will receive not only the program to take back home to install, but also a training manual. Many users relate to us that SXXI saves them many hours over previous methods, and it would be in your best interest to have newly assigned personnel take this course or perhaps refresh your knowledge of the program.
