The Governor's Single Point of Contact (SPOC) will continue to oversee many elements of statewide communications interoperability planning and the development of the NPSBN for Alaska to include the development and implementation of the
State Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), the establishment of Policies and Procedures and continue the outreach efforts within local and tribal groups within the state.

We continue to pursue the pilot project adding 20 Alaska Village Public Safety Officers (VPSO) to FirstNet Push-To-Talk (PTT) integrated with our Alaska Land Mobile Radio system. We have met with both AT&T/FirstNet and Motorola and feel we have a technical solution which meets our needs.

During this Quarter, we established a bi-weekly meeting to discuss the transition to FirstNet. These meeting have focused on the creation of 2 separate contracts to provide SLIPG allowable activities. In October, Kevin McGinnis and I presented "FirstNet Update and the Alaska Plan" to the State Emergency Response Commission.
