The Governor's Single Point of Contact (SPOC) will continue to oversee many elements of statewide communications interoperability planning and the development of the NPSBN for Alaska to include the development and implementation of the State Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), the establishment of Policies and Procedures and continue the outreach efforts within local and tribal groups within the state.

We continue to pursue the pilot project adding 20 Alaska Village Public Safety Officers (VPSO) to FirstNet Push-To-Talk (PTT) integrated with our Alaska Land Mobile Radio system. To facilitate this, we have received 4 Sonim XP8's formatted for a local carrier GCI support cross carrier connection to FirstNet and will provision these units with FirstNet's EPTT. - Due to the extensive fires throughout Alaska these units have been configured with EPTT on a donner radio tuned to the Alaska Forestry talk group (Palmer Alaska Dispatch). These units have been deployed around Alaska for EPTT communication and seems to be working well.

During this Quarter, we have created a Task Order contract with Televate and Mission Critical Partners. The first Task Order for them to respond to is: i. Allowable activities for States where FirstNet is deploying the RAN (Opt-In States) for (Planning activities to prepare for emergency communications technology transitions) with a due date of 4-19-2019. — We received excellent proposals and negotiating with the perspective winner.

Another focus point is to asses coverage objectives for the future state of the Network. To this end the State Office of information Technology (OIT) has been purchasing FirstNet devices to casually report coverage issues and work with Public 12. Personnel
