The Governor's Single Point of Contact (SPOC) will continue to oversee many elements of statewide communications interoperability planning and the development of the NPSBN for Alaska to include the development and implementation of the
State Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), the establishment of Policies and Procedures and continue the outreach efforts within local and tribal groups within the state.

We continue to utilize FirstNet devices configured with EPTT on a donner radio tuned to the Alaska Forestry talk group (Palmer Alaska Dispatch). Also durring this quarter we asked L3Harris to demonstrate their new push to talk radio with a FirstNet sim connected to the ALMR network. This project will continue into the next reporting period.

We continue to meet with AT&T / FirstNet to discuss the best method to integrate FirstNet into our Alaska Land Mobile Radio network via an ISSI adaptor.

We continue to assess coverage objectives for the future state of the Network. To this end the State Office of Information Technology (OIT) has been purchasing FirstNet devices to casually report coverage issues and work with Public Safety entities currently utilizing land mobile radios.
