The best practice that we implemented during the SLIGP project was the governance structure implemented by the Alabama First Responders Wireless Commission (AFRWC). AFRWC has become a stable governance structure for Alabama first responder communication stakeholders. Before the creation of AFRWC, Alabama did not have a cohesive focus communications structure. Local and state public safety agencies were working in their own silos to undertake communications projects. Now AFRWC provides a venue for state and local agencies to collaborate in the communications arena. Although not all of Alabama's communication needs have been met, AFRWC has had success in improving public safety communications in Alabama.

Activities: During this time frame, Alabama engaged over 6300 stakeholders on the national Public Safety Broadband network. This engagement occurred in many different settings. This included engaging professional public safety associations at their meetings to include, but not limited to the Alabama Sheriff Association, Alabama Chiefs of Police Association, Alabama Fire Chiefs Association, Alabama Volunteer Fire Association, Alabama Rescue Squad Association, Alabama Emergency Medical Services Association, Association of County Commissions of Alabama, Alabama League of Municipalities. Alabama's only federally recognized native American tribe, the Poarch band of Creek Indians were enraged as well.

Individuals Sent to Broadband Conferences 09/2013-02/2018

<u>Activities:</u> Alabama sent stakeholders to relevant conferences were public safety broadband was the main topic or secondary topic. This included conference such as APCO International and the International Wireless Communications Expo (IWCE). These experiences allowed Alabama stakeholders to gather knowledge from government and industry representatives on the latest trends and updates with public safety broadband. This knowledge was communicated back to public safety professional associations and the Alabama First Responders Wireless Commission.
