The Statewide Interoperability Governing Body is the Arkansas Interoperable Communications Committee. The committee met 65 times during the grant period and formed the Arkansas Public Broadband Network (APSBN) in 2012. The APSBN completed the Public Safety Broadband Strategic Planc that laid the groundwork for Arkansas to respond to FirstNet's requirements. During the grant period nearly 4000 stateholders were engaged across the state at townhall meetings, conferences, and various other public meeting forums. The state completed surveys and Interviews of public safety responders from every county and established a sampling of large and small cities and towns to determine public safety broadband needs and potential public safety users of the broadband network.

The Arkansas Interoperable Communications Committee and Arkansas Interoperable Communications Executive Committee will continue beyond the SLIGP period of performance. Arkansas will also continue with the Statewide Interoperability Plan (SCIP) and the developement of a statewide NG911 plan that we seel is closely related to the public broadband network.
