Efforts during the first half of the quarter were focused on facilitating the review and evaluation of the state plan utilizing the established State Plan Review team. Several in-person and webinar meetings were held with stakeholders to gather input and answer questions on various aspects of the plan. AT&T and FirstNet staff participated in several meetings to address questions directly from the state plan review team members.

In August, the Arizona Governor made the decision to opt-in to FirstNet. The state planning team continued to work with FirstNet and AT&T throughout the quarter to address questions from the evaluation team and further define the details of the Arizona plan including work with the Arizona State Procurement Office to ensure the Arizona pricing was included in the appropriate procurement contracts.
