We have also developed a web-site for meeting announcements, registration, surveys, presentation materials and current news.

Describe your progress meeting each major activity/milestone approved in the Baseline Report for this project; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project milestones or information.

We are continuing to work on re-establishing our executive level governance in response to the sunset of our primary governance body, the Public Safety Communications Advisory Commission (PSCC). Our Arizona Public Safety Broadband Network (AZPSBN) Workgroup made up of a combination of about 30 public safety, emergency management, elected officials, Public Safety Answering Point/dispatch and information technology personnel is filling the role temporarily.

- 1. Stakeholder Meetings Arizona hosted a panel discussion at the Western Regional APCO meeting in Phoenix featuring the FirstNet Single Points of Contact from California and Nevada. The focus was on education and outreach efforts across the western states. In addition, we provided an informational table with Arizona FirstNet promotional materials. The Arizona FirstNet team was invited to present at the BIA Tribal Assistance Coordination Group (TAC-G) National Workshop being held in Phoenix at the Ft McDowell Yavapai Nation. We were able to include Kristi Wilde from the FirstNet Outreach program. There were over 60 people with Arizona ties in attendance at the session. The Southwest Border Communications Working Group (SWBCWG) held a meeting in Phoenix hosted by the Arizona Bureau of Land Management with approximately 20 Arizona stakeholders present over half of the session was dedicated to FirstNet with presentations by Amanda Hilliard, FirstNet Outreach Director, and Dave Buchanan, FirstNet State Consultation Director. In addition, the Arizona FirstNet team had an informational table about the Arizona FirstNet Program. Our major accomplishments for the quarter were the 10 County level kickoff meetings we held throughout the State. These meetings were attended by nearly 200 key stakeholders (almost exclusively first responders) and covered background information and the current status of FirstNet, the Arizona FirstNet Program and state consultation process. In addition, we had breakouts covering secondary users, current usage, agency validation and coverage requirements. The quarterly total was 291 which was under projections but we have 5 more County level meetings coming up to complete this portion of our Education and Outreach.
- 2. Training Sessions none were planned.
- 3. Broadband Conferences The Arizona FirstNet team were on the FirstNet Quarterly Single Point-of-Contact (SPOC) Webinar and the FirstNet Monthly Call with FEMA Region IX States and Territories. Our team along with Arizona Stakeholders attended the Southwest Border Communications Working Group (SWBCWG) meeting in Phoenix as described in #1 above. Finally, 4 Arizona FirstNet team member and 3 Arizona stakeholders attended the Public Safety Communications Research (PSCR)

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- Annual Stakeholder Conference in Colorado. We had 17 people attending Broadband conferences/webinars overall which exceeds our projected 13 people for the reporting period.
- 4. Staff Hires (Full Time Equivalent) There were no new staff hires planned during the third quarter.
- 5. Contract Executions No new Contract executions, however, 2 contractors from the PSIC Office were made available to the Arizona FirstNet Program through the existing Knowledge Services Contract.
- 6. Statutory or Regulatory Changes none were planned.
- 7. Governance meetings Of the 8 planned for a full quarter we had 8 total meetings/briefings for the fourth quarter as follows: three Governor's briefings for Mar. Apr and May and five AZPSBN Workgroup meetings on 4/2, 4/16, 5/14, 6/11.
- 8. Education and Outreach Materials Development of the outreach materials/web site (<u>www.azfirstnet.az.gov</u>) are complete and have been distributed to ~200 people from over 10 Counties in Arizona. Each participant in the County level meetings received a packet with 8 handouts.

The Baseline Report does not need to be modified at this time although we are planning on reevaluating our overall plan in light of the changes to the PSIC and the PSIC Office for the next reporting period and we are reducing our planned spending rate of Federal funds until we can reassess and develop an adjusted spending plan.

We continue to restrict our planned baseline expenditures to counter the impacts of the closure of the PSIC Office whose staff positions were going to be a major contributor to the State's share of the effort. Our County Kickoff Meetings have provided a significant level of In-kind contribution and may be enough to counter the loss of the PSIC office staff. We continue to meet our portion of the 80/20 split.
- 11d. Describe any success stories or best practices you have identified. Please be as specific as possible. We continue to work with the Western States (16 State POCs with a focus on the common issues of rural coverage and tribal interaction) and this quarter proved very worthwhile for the Western Regional APCO meeting. During one of our County level meetings we were invited to speak before the council of the White Mountain Apache.
