The Colorado Public Safety Broadband Governing Body met on November 17th, 2018 to get an update on the SLIGP 2.0 funded projects and the possibility of bringing public safety broadband governance under the purview of the Public Safety Communications Subcommittee eventually. The Colorado Public Safety Broadband Governing Board also held a meeting on October 1st, 2018 to discuss with FirstNet and AT&T the concerns state in the FCC filing of July 2018 regarding interoperability between networks. Both governing board members and local stateholders attended the meeting. The CBO has was not able to make much progress on the data sharing initiative except for a presentation created for the NTIA to be given in Q1 of 2019. The CBO was not able to make much progress on the technology transition initiative to support understanding LMR to LTE integration for the existing LMR networks across the state; it anticipates completing a procurement to hire a contractor to support these activities in the next quarter.
