Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project. The Colorado Public Safety Broadband Governing Body (CPSBGB) met on February 28th, 2019 to get an update on the SLIGP 2.0 funded projects and the possibility of bringing public safety broadband governance under the purview of the Public Safety Communications Subcommittee eventually. The body put a motion to vote and has decided to sunset the board as of March 5th, 2019. The Outreach and Education Manager went to IWCE in Las Vegas. In June, the Outreach and Education Manager and the Project Manager will be attending a state conference titled Mountain Connect which regsitration was paid for this quarter. The CBO was not able to make much progress on the technology transition initiative to support understanding LMR to LTE integration for the existing LMR networks across the state; due to the transition in the governor's office and the changes to the Colorado Broadband Office's team, we are unsure as to when these initiatives will be supported.

13b. Narrative description any challenges, updates, or changes related to contracts and/or subrecipients.

The vendors selected from the three DQ's published last quarter are Soluteia for6 Samsung S9 handheld devices with the WINd application installed, Wireless Advanced Communications (WAC) for 5 MG90 in-vehicle router device, and Signals Analytics for professional services. After the vendor WAC was awarded the DQ and the PO was written, WAC was purchased by BearCom and has agreed to provide the same services as decsribed in the DQ and PO. The Colorado Broadband Office has received devices from both WAC/BearCom and Solutelia and has begun work with Signals Analytics to define the process for data collection and analysis. The first stakeholders to recieve handheld devices were from Vail PD and Eagle County Sheriffs. The devices were returned early March and the data has been formatted and a presented to the stakeholders (presentation included in backup for this quarter). The Colorado Parks and Wildlife has both an in-vehicle modem and handheld devices and will be conducting testing in April. The contract with Signals Analytics has ended in the month of March due to the fact that the work was completed before we expected and we not longer needed to keep the contract open.
