Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project For January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019 Connecticut Staff continued with collecting coverage and capacity gap information for AT&T to be aware of and consider in their future build out plans. Three Governance Group (SIEC) meetings were held, one each month for January, February, and March 2019. Two CT Staff members attended a meeting with Information Technology staff and managers from the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) and AT&T to provide them information regarding FirstNet and also outline the adoption steps of FirstNet for key individuals in their agency. Two CT Staff members participated in the quarterly confernce call with NTIA Staff. A Connecticut Staff member participated in a conference call with our NTIA Program Manager Regina Harrison along with Mike Dame and Natile Romanoff to clarifiy ongoing activities. The FirstNet bi weekly information updates were sent out to members of the Broadband Working Group, who in turn send them out to to their discipline contacts. The grant signatory authority for DESPP has changed to Commisoner James C. Rovella and a letter was submitted to NTIA with his contact information. On March 15, 2019 a meeting was condcuted between AT&T, FirstNet Staff and authorized individuals who have access to the FirstNet State Plan. This in-depth update, provided information regarding the addition of Band Class 14 sites as well as other system improvements. An update was also provided regarding new system subscribers. In March/April 2019 the Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security will be the first Division within the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection to transition to firstNet.
