Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the SIEC Executive Council meeting that should have been held in April was canceled. One (1) SIEC Sub-committee meeting was held during this quarter and this was conducted via a conference call on June 25th that had 15 members in attendance. As everyone knows, due to the pandemic and then followed by protests and disturbances, almost every company / department / agency has been on "lock down" and not admitting anyone. With that in mind, I did maintain contact with many of the Delaware agencies via phone calls and emails, informing them of FirstNet resources that are available to them if needed. On several occasions I was able to meet with personnel outside of their buildings and discuss items "one on one". As a follow up to the initial meeting in February with DSHH's Office of Animal Control, Eric Wagner, Rob Walls (AT&T / FirstNet) and myself held several conference and Webex calls with OAW during this quarter with the intent of assisting them with a plan to transition them from primarily using the 800 system to FirstNet with the use of SONIM devices. The end result was that AT&T / FirstNet agreed to place them on a "pilot program" at minimal initial cost, with this being implemented mid May for their statewide force of 27 personnel. This pilot involves their road staff statewide being dispatched to calls for service. Updates received thus far are very good with no issues being reported. With everything received being positive, hopefully OAW will decide to move all of their communication needs to FirstNet by the conclusion of the 90 day pilot. Our intent, once the pilot is completed, is to then utilize the findings to assist us in our continued outreach to other agencies within Delaware.
