Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project SIEC Executive Council meetings were held in Dover, De on April 11th and June 13th, with attendance being 17 and 19 respectively. During both of these meetings, the statewide interoperability communication and the NPSBN - Firstnet initiative was discussed. SIEC Sub-committee meetings were held on both May 30th and June 27th, with attendance being 9 and 8 respectively, during which discussions were conducted regarding the current status of Firstnet within the state. The State of Delaware held a SCIP workshop at the Delaware State Fire School on May 7th with 54 attendees from local agencies in attendance. FIRSTNet representatives were on hand and discussed NPSBN and how it will incorporate into the plan, as well as answered many questions from the attendees. During the September meeting of the Delaware Police Chief's Council on September 10th, we are planning a "breakfast and learn" session that will further supply information on FirstNet progress throughout the state, including feedback from agencies already utilizing it.
