Three FirstNet/NTIA/FloridaNet conference calls were held during the quarter, April 27, May 25, and June 28, respectively. A total of 26 participated on the three calls.								
The Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP) workshop was held in Orlando June 1-3. The purpose of the workshop was to modify the SCIP by incorporating the FirstNet/FloridaNet initiatives to provide direction and alignment for

On July 13, 2016, the State of Florida's Governor Rick Scott appointed a new State Point of Contact (SPOC), Chad Poppell, Secretary of the Florida Department of Management Services (DMS). The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles will transition from the role of subrecipient and DMS will become a subrecipient and assume all programmatic activities of the FloridaNet grant. The Florida Division of Emergency Management will remain as the recipient for the SLIGP grant.

Three FirstNet/NTIA/FloridaNet conference calls were held during the quarter, July 18, August 10, and September 28. A total of 32 people participated on the three calls.

One FloridaNet team member went to the Criminal Juvenile Justice Information Systems Council meeting and the Criminal Justice Information system Symposium in Orlando July 18 and 19. He updated attendees on Florida's design efforts associated with the NPSBN and the progress made by FirstNet. He also provided a detailed review of Florida's efforts with a focus on the importance of local first responder participation and collaboration.

The Quality of Service Priority and Preemption Consultation Task Teams meeting in Atlanta on August 10 was attended by three FloridaNet team members and one technical committee member. The purpose of the meeting was to meet with FirstNet and discuss the overall initiative.

Four FloridaNet team members and six executive/technical committee members attended the Association of Public-Safety Communication Officials (APCO) conference in Orlando August 14-16 to learn more about the FirstNet initiative.

On September 8, the Executive Committee Meeting was held in Tallahassee, with 34 members and stakeholders attending and 21 members and stakeholders participating on-line. FloridaNet and FirstNet staff led presentations and discussed the transition of the project activities from DHSMV to DMS, the status of the data collection RFQ, and the overall progress of FirstNet.

As part of Florida's continued education and outreach, the FloridaNet.gov website received 505 unique sessions. Two email broadcasts of "Latest News Alerts" were sent out to the FloridaNet membership.
