DMS's subcontractor ISF conducted 7 regional live workshops. FirstNet conducted three metro engagements in Miami, Orlando, and Tampa. The regional workshops had 154 attendees while the metro engagements had 173 attendees. FirstNet and AT&T attended and presented in the workshops. July 11, the FloridaNet Executive board meeting was held. FirstNet and AT&T attended and presented. ISF reporting on the data collection project. The total aggregate of DMS employees working on the SLIGP grant is 4.2. During the quarter, there were 612 hits on the FloridaNet website. For the period of July 1 to September 30, 2017, FloridaNet gained 15 followers (555 to 570) and are following 616 accounts. They include local governments and PSE throughout Florida. Members of the board reviewed the ISF Rollout Plan and the State Plan Review. All activities are at phase 5 and 6, except the State Plan Decision. Current activities are being driven to support the State Plan Decision. During September, the State of Florida was impacted by Hurricane Irma. The event was a Federally declared disaster area, 68% of Florida's Counties were affected, and the State Emergency Operation Center was at a Level 1 - Full-Scale Activation of State Emergency Response Team with the priority of saving lives, protecting property and meeting basic human needs. The State of Florida requested a delay from FirstNet in delivering the letter to the Governor and delivery of the final plan. It was denied.
