- 11a. Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; and any additional project
  During the quarter, activities continued to focus on finalizing and signing a statewide contract for the purchasing of Public Safety Grade Wireless Data Services, including those offered by AT&T FirstNet. The PSBO actively participated in the reprocurement of the Cellular Services statewide contract, which includes a sub-category for Public Safety Grade Wireless Data Services. Members of the PSBO led a multi-departmental negotiating team to qualify vendors to sell priority-based LTE
  services in the Commonwealth via this new statewide contract. In April, these agreements were finalized and AT&T/FirstNet was approved to sell Public Safety Grade Wireless Data Services to municipal and Commonwealth agencies. During this
  quarter, kick-off account meetings with AT&T/FirstNet were planned and conducted.
- 11.1 Governance Meetings: A governance meeting was conducted on May 24, including Secretary Wood, Assistant Secretary Moran, and members of the PSBO. There were frequent planning and oversight interactions with the Massachusetts SPOC and other SLIGP executive stakeholders.
- 11.7 Data Sharing Policies/Agreements Developed: Continued to work with AT&T to communicate security and access standards for connecting FirstNet users with criminal history data stores at the Department of Criminal Justice Information Services. This remains a critical path item for use of FirstNet by law enforcement in Massachusetts. A pilot of this criminal justice data access on FirstNet is currently underway. During this period several issues were identified and DCJIS staff supported the user needs of the pilot agencies.
- 11.8 Further Identification of Potential Public Safety Users: Updated contact lists for communications to public safety leaders throughout the Commonwealth. Used contractual and oversight authority to help assure that Public Safety Grade Wireless Data Services Service Agreement provide the services needed by public safety officials in Massachusetts. Drafted a newsletter to public safety officials explaining the new contract for public safety grade services and providing updates on FirstNet-related matters. The newsletter was sent out on May 31 and was received by 1,457 public safety officials and others.
- 11.11 Identify Ongoing Coverage Gaps: Worked with AT&T on planning which state buildings require in-building FirstNet coverage and coordinated state involvement in the planning for in-building FirstNet coverage at critical sites in Massachusetts. Worked with AT&T coverage team on how best to address public safety needs in Franklin County. Discussed needs and approach to addressing LTE tower placement in state parks and other properties.
