We experienced a late start in our Identify and Doucment Coverage Gap initiative. We had planned to partner with two state agencies that trave; statewide to collect the data, however they decided against participating in the middle of the planning stage and we had to reach out to local agencies to assist us with the data gathering. This put us behind schedule and we were not able to collect data across the entire state. The information we gathered was very valuable for the state in verifying actual coverage against FirstNet-reported coverage, and partner agencies were able to use the collected information in determining whether the coverage would support transitioning to FirstNet or to negotiate additional infrastructure. Lessons learned would be to start with as many partners as possible at the start of the project.
