11a. Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project milestones or NC DIT continued to be involved with NPSBN planning for this quarter and had a ramp up in SLIGP2.0 activities. This quarter, DIT staff worked with their consultant firm to develop content and host the pilot data-sharing workshops. NC sent eight individuals to an event hosted by the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) in Baltimore, MD this past August. DIT Staff also attended NIST PSCR's Annual Stakeholder Event in Chicago, IL, however only the Program Specialist was funded using SLIGP2.0 funds. The SIEC (Governance body) met this quarter. Program staff identified potential Public Safety users while attending various events and meetings with municipal leaders and state agencies. The SPOC position dedicated 15.6% of his work to SLIGP2 activities and the Program Specialist dedicated 22.6%. Future work entails holding our nine datsharing workshops all over the state. DIT Staff continues to communicate regularly with the consulting firm on the development of the workshop content as well as handling any logistical needs for the workshops.

12b. Narrative description of any staffing challenges, vacancies, or changes.

FirstNet SPOC is budgeted for 30% of that position and the Program Specialist is budgeted for 60% to focus on allowable SLIGP2 activities as in-kind match. Actual time spent is recorded and match is calculated based on actual allowable activities. Technical Specialist added July 1, 2019 to provide detailed technical knowledge for data sharing workshop content and delivery as well as looking into State Plan coverage of the NPSBN. While the FirstNet SPOC and Program Specialist are state funded and their time is reported as in-kind match, the Technical Specialist role is being funded at 50% by federal SLIGP2 funds. This change will still fall within the total budgeted amount for Salaries and Benefits.

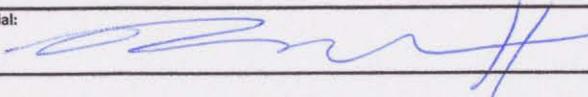

The contract was executed with that delivery contractor, work is ongoing, and funds have been spent on content development and registration website construction.
