11a. Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project As this quarter marked the end of the Administration of one Governor and transition to a new Administration, travel was limited; thus, there were no broadband conferences attended nor meetings called as Department leadership also changed. Within the state, staff worked closely with the State 911 entity, currently housed within DoIT to plan for technology transition which would promote the successful use of the NPSBN in areas of the state where coverage may exist. One of the key challenges is that the state 911 PSAPs are not yet ESINET prepared; as they plan forward for their federal grant to help them prepare for the new technology, the Deputy SPOC worked with local entities to discuss options, opportunities and challenges that will arise with technology transfer. All work is preparatory to PSAPs, particularly in rural areas, being able to ask relevant questions in considering choices of carriers, particularly considering issues of interoperability. Discussions are very preliminary as to what type of data will be shared and who owns the data. In collaborating with local government and state government on procurements related to the NPSBN, insights are gained with regard to the types of considerations that potential customers should consider, e.g. interoperability, coverage, technology training, staffing issues. All of the discussions are challenges to the NPSBN, particularly as coverage in NM is limited. While coverage is growing as ATT builds out, rural areas remain a challenge. With regard to getting FN/ATT on a state price agreement, there continues to be a misunderstanding as to how purchasing actually works in NM. While ATT/FN did get on the national NASPO contract, until there is an amendment to the NM participating agreement, specific to NM, FN services are not available to Executive Branch agencies. Since August 2018 the state collaborated with FN/ATT with regard to changes to the ATT draft; to date, they have not responded to NM recommended changes to language, thus, state entities are unable to purchase FN under the existing NASPO NM Participating Amendment. The new State Purchasing Agent is now in place but has not been fully briefed on the matters which has further challenged anything moving forward. Once the legislature finished and the new Secretary for General Services, which is over Procurement, is in place, such challenges may be mitigated. At this time, the biggest challenge is interoperability and the lack of coverage, particularly in the rural areas. No band 14 build is expected before 3-5 years. The additional challenge for the Department's management of SLIGP and its attendant goals is that the key individual with full understanding of the project left DoIT in mid-February 2019. Such loss leaves only the financial coordinator to perform the goals of the grant. Thus, the state has been granted early termination of the SLIGP2 grant.
