[#3] While the State of Oklahoma did not convene an official stakeholder meeting this quarter at the request of the FirstNet Authority, the State did participate in a Focus Group on the Mission Critical Push-to-Talk Application in development by FirstNet-Built with AT&T. 30 Stakeholders attended this Focus Group from across the State of Oklahoma - There was no cost associated with this meeting; therefore, the Authority did not provide a letter. [#7] The State of Oklahoma used SLIGP 2.0 Staff to begin reviewing Data Sharing Policies between State Agencies during incidents and declared disasters. The Staff are currently reviewing best practices of Data Sharing in the Public Safety environment and providing recommendations - Project is ongoing. [#9] SLIGP 2.0 Staff have been attending meetings and conferences with multiple disciplines including, but not limited to: Fire Chiefs, Sheriff and Peace Officers, Emergency Management, and the Oklahoma Highway Patrol to review the Emergency Communications technologies currently in play within specific agencies and provide recommendations/best practices for incorporating the NPSBN. [#10] SLIGP 2.0 Staff have been meeting with the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety / Oklahoma Highway Patrol to identify and review the current Public Safety Applications and Features in use for day-to-day operations and situational awareness and discuss transition planning to the NPSBN which is scheduled to begin at the start of the new fiscal year - Project is ongoing.
