Narrative description for each activity reported in Question 11 for this quarter; any challenges or obstacles encountered and mitigation strategies you have employed; planned major activities for the next quarter; and any additional project During the quarter, no stakeholder events were held by the PA-FirstNet team in the traditional sense; however, stakeholders were invited to attend a workshop to assist in re-writing our Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP) where Broadband is being incorporated into the plan where it previously had no presence. No governance meetings were held during the quarter. The team did participate in a meeting with the AT&T Radio Access Network team to discuss progress on the new towers that are to be added to the project as part of Pennsylvania's decision to Opt-In. Our Deputy SPOC attended the Roadmap consultation in Phoenix, AZ in June. The time devoted to the project has been tracked and was submitted as documentation of the expenditures to be devoted to the grant. The expenditures for the time contributed during the April through June period, a total of \$21,079.26, will show up on the next quarterly report. The state match on this report reflects time from the first quarter of the project through March 2019.
