There were no governance meetings scheduled during the quarter. The time devoted to the project has been tracked and was submitted as documentation of the expenditures to be devoted to the grant. A portion of the expenditures for the time contributed during the January through March period, show up on this report since the civilian employees' time was gathered together for January and February and submitted to our Budget office in early March. The remainder of the expenditures, \$14,076.32, will be submitted in April and will show up on the next quarterly report. All time was collected in Sharepoint. This quarter the time for the civilian employees in January and February was collected and posted within the month of March. The time for the month of March, as well as the entire quarter for the enlisted team members, will show up as an expenditure next quarter in the amount of \$14,076.32 of additional state match. This time was a reflection of meetings with AT&T and DCNR to discuss tower locations; conferences calls with our consultants and the NTIA; as well as for grant administration.
