I would like to applaud and commend the NTIA for soliciting the Notice of Inquiry **Docket No. 100504212-0212-01** seeking comment on technical approaches to preventing contraband cell phone use in prisons. This is a rapidly growing worldwide problem greatly in need of a solution.
