2	We provided broadband internet services to the citizens of the Pinoleville Pomo Nation, as well as other tribal citizens in Mendocino, Lake, and Sonoma Counties. Our digital skills classes were available both in-person and virtually, with a specific focus on Mendocino County, which serves as the central location for the Pinoleville Pomo Nation. Our services were extended to three separate counties. The actual number of project locations is 120 Tribal Households and 5 Anchor Institutions.

4	The grant funds have enabled us to make a significant investment in the digital infrastructure and support for our community. We hired and trained for the positions of Broadband Administrator and Broadband Outreach Coordinator, thereby increasing our staff capacity to manage Tribal Broadband and assist Pinoleville Pomo Nation's current Network Administrator. We were able to hire a Broadband Administrator and a Broadband Outreach Coordinator for the duration of the grant. We have

We have delivered 2 digital skills workshops. The first workshop was training on Canva digital skills. Our employees as well as Pinoleville Pomo Nation Citizens attended, Learning

12	Difficulty finding a qualified applicant for the administrator position: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic we faced challenges in finding a suitable candidate to fill the administrator position. Onsite training barriers we faced could be due to COVID-19 pandemic but we overcame these barriers by making some adjustments, we were able to hire and fill both the Broadband Coordinator and Broadband Administrator positions and we shifted to a self-paced online training. This approach offered more flexibility and could accommodate a greater amount of participants. 1) Hiring delay we were delayed in finding a qualified applicant to accept the position as Broadband Outreach Coordinator and

14	During our end-of-year grant review, we are pleased to report that we closely followed the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) and its requirements. Despite receiving the NOFO just one to two weeks before the deadline, we developed a proposal that aligned with the opportunity's objectives. Unfortunately, due to time constraints, we were unable to pursue our initial infrastructure development goal and instead focused on promoting broadband adoption and usage. Nevertheless, the NOFO was instrumental in guiding our process and ensuring our submission met the specified criteria.

16	Running a successful summer IT youth Internship with 14 youth interns, we had originally planned on 12 youth interns but we had 14 youth interested so we went with 14 interns. We provided them with 250 hours of training both virtually and in person. 125 hours of hands-on and training in person 125 hours of in class training and learning hands-on computer skills and later provided 125 hours of digital and technical support hands on support. Tribal Elders and individuals with disabilities were trained by the interns. Interns were given a stipend for attending and completing the internship as well as for training elders and the disabled on the ipads.
