3. Subcommittee Status Reports and Discussion

- Spectrum Inventory Subcommittee (Mark Crosby and Jennifer Warren) –The subcommittee will meet with NTIA and FCC staff to discuss each agency's efforts on spectrum inventory. In addition to their assigned task, the subcommittee is also examining the benefits of the spectrum inventory and whether appropriate funding levels are in place to accommodate agency's spectrum inventory activities. The subcommittee will meet report timelines set and offer specific enumerated recommendations.
- Transparency Subcommittee (Darrin Mylet) The subcommittee is identifying a definition of spectrum transparency that includes both internal (classified) and external (non-classified) spectrum transparency. The subcommittee chair provided slides that depicted licensed frequency by channel, contour and geographic area, and ownership. The subcommittee will meet report timelines set and offer specific enumerated recommendations.
- Adjacent Band Interference/Dynamic Spectrum Access Subcommittee (David Donovan) The subcommittee is examining adjacent channel interference and sensing/avoidance. The subcommittee is also developing a technical definition of interference (low, medium, high/powerful). The subcommittee will meet report timelines set and offer specific enumerated recommendations.
- Incentives Subcommittee (Rick Reaser) The subcommittee will examine how to incentivize program managers on dealing with spectrum which will require examination of issues across all levels of users and responsible entities. In addition, the subcommittee will examine the 2008 NTIA report, categorize the recommendations, and provide pros and cons to each of the recommendations. The subcommittee will meet report timelines set and offer specific enumerated recommendations.

- Harold Feld, Legal Director, Public Knowledge Mr. Feld asked whether the committee would take into account the IRAC's underlying statute regarding transparency and where he could submit comments. Mr. Gattuso stated he would be the point of contact.
- Michael J. Marcus/Marcus Spectrum Solutions LLC -- Mr. Marcus submitted written comments on the issue of defining harmful interference.
